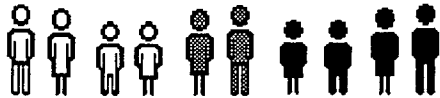

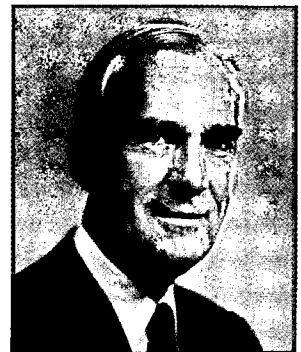

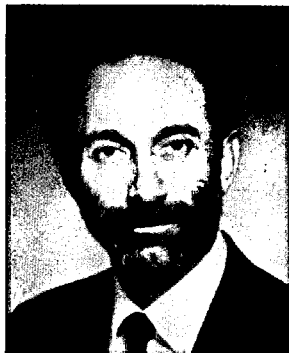

A Historical Note

“We Are Engaged In The Greatest Work of Modern Times”

This marks the thirteenth occasion the Association has met in the City of Raleigh. the first such meeting was held on Monday, June 15, 1914. At that time the Association was known as the North Carolina Health Officers' Association and it met in conjunction with the annual convention of the North Carolina Medical Society.

The day-long meeting was chaired by President Dr. George Marion Cooper, one of the true pioneers of public health in our state and for whom the Cooper Memorial Health Building in Raleigh is named. He was assisted in his work by Dr. William M. Jones, Vice-President, and Dr. Watson Smith Rankin, Secretary-Treasurer.

At the time of the meeting, a clock was ticking in a countdown that would end world peace. Events in Europe were to have a profound impact on the United States and all those gathered at the meeting. Thirteen days later, Sunday, June 28, 1914, Archduke Francis Ferdinand, heir to the Austrian Throne, and his wife were assassinated in Sarajevo which resulted in a declaration of war and the beginning of World War I. This first truly “modern” war would last more than four years, involve over thirty nations, cost billions of dollars, destroy much of Europe, claim ten million lives, and plant the seeds of World War II. This event represented the beginning of a series of confrontations that would make the twentieth century one of the most violent in recorded history.

Dr. Cooper's Presidential Address was entitled “Public Health Work in North Carolina.” It was a prophetic presentation with profound observations. For example, “If North Carolina, in common with the other states of the South is to build up and maintain a strong rural life, sweeping changes must take place. More attention must be paid to community effort and less importance attached to individual methods of doing things”.

A number of other presentations were made at the meeting. They included: “State Responsibility for Human Life” by Governor Locke Craig; “The State's Tuberculosis Policy” by Dr. L. B. McBrayer; “The Medical Inspector's Relation to Mentally Defective Children” by Dr. H. C. Chase; “Sanitary for Survey of Schools” by Dr. B. E. Washburn; “Fundamental Principles in Rural Quarantine” by Dr. Arch Cheatham and an interesting

“Program for the Summer Months for the Whole-Time Health Officer”
by Dr. William M. Jones.

Dr. Cooper’s closing remarks sound strangely contemporary:

“Gentleman (and gentlewomen), we are engaged in the greatest work of modern times, the amelioration of suffering and the conservation of human life. Our work is in the quiet places, the laboratory, the schoolroom, with disease charts and the cause and prevention of disease. When we do have to go out on the firing line it is often in the performance of unpleasant tasks, and consequently we are the target for many shafts, some of them poisonedWhen we give the best of service, it is often years before the very people most benefited realize what has been done for them. But when I think of the hundreds of thousands of children in North Carolina constituting our most important asset—when I think of the possibilities of such a future citizenship, I am willing to give my own part, my life, for such a cause.”²
